



A MESSAGE FROM ELCA PRESIDING BISHOP ELIZABETH EATON

Dear friends in Christ,

This year has been a challenging one! The COVID-19 pandemic has changed the church and society. We have had to shift the ways we engage in ministry from a focus on in-person worship and meetings to livestream worship, virtual meetings and gatherings in the parking lot. We have had to shift to teaching children at home and working from home. We have not been able to travel to see friends or relatives or to celebrate life events. This has also been a time to address economic and social justice issues, to shift our thinking and our way of life.

In times such as this, our baptism in Christ makes a difference and makes us different. Like Christians before us, we recall that God is faithful to God's promises and God's people. We see that God enables us to connect with one another even when we are separated. Shifts in the world invite us to be innovative in how we do God's work and reach out to all ages in making disciples. We see that God is at work not only in our buildings but beyond them as well. We have found new ways to serve our neighbors and reach those in need.

As we experience this time of uncertainty, we sense something new emerging. In many places there are new strategies and renewed energy for ministry, often generated by emerging leaders. We have developed a framework to build on, and now is the time to engage in hard work together. As you do in your congregation, we want our collaborative efforts to be both faithfully thoughtful and sustainable. We want to build up the body of Christ today and for the future. Looking across the church, I am grateful for your generous giving of time, talents and resources. Yes, God does continue to bless us! God will provide both relief from life's struggles and hope for a stronger church, God's church. We do not need to know how the future will unfold. As members in the body of Christ, we need only trust that God is with us and will provide.

In the early verses of Ephesians 4, the apostle Paul writes to the Christians in Ephesus, a city on the Aegean Sea at the mouth of a river and at the intersection of three trading routes. The letter was written about ten years after the church had started. During the early years of this congregation, Jews and Gentiles from several ethnicities and nationalities had come together to form "one body." Paul was aware that they had done well and commended them for their faith and love.

The word "one" appears more than seven times in the first four verses. This reflects the importance Paul gave to being called into the "unity of Christ." He wanted to note that, although many of the church members came from far off, there is "one Lord, one faith, one baptism." This oneness reflects God's gift of reconciliation in Christ.

A second emphasis from Paul was that, as believers, they were to "bear with one another in love." This would require humility, gentleness and patience as each of them practiced their faith. It would require tolerance to "maintain unity of the Spirit in the bond of peace."

A third emphasis was that each person had been given gifts by God and that these gifts were given to increase the whole. Because the Ephesian church was a young congregation and its members were just beginning in their faith journey, their understandings were often tossed to and fro. But as they grew in faith, each person contributed to building up the body of Christ.

The fourth and final emphasis was that by "speaking the truth in love," each person must grow into Christ. This means taking time to learn about one another and their gifts. Knowing these gifts, we can do God's work both within and beyond the faith community. When there are decisions to make or relationships to reconcile, we know to begin with prayer and reflection, always desiring to speak the truth in love — not for our own benefit but for God's glory, that we might become more complete. As our members and friends gather today, whether face-to-face or online, we are reminded of our calling into "unity in Christ." We come from many places and work in many contexts, and yet we recognize "one Lord, one faith, one baptism."

Whether new to a worshiping community or further along the journey, we realize that humility, gentleness and patience are required both in the good times and especially in times of uncertainty and struggle. God wants us to be more complete through our work. Christ provides the way. The Holy Spirit is with us for guidance and courage. Each of us has been given the gifts to be complete, and through our faithfulness we will grow stronger and work together as one body.

LET US PRAY: LORD, LET THE WORDS OF THE APOSTLE PAUL DWELL IN US DEEPLY. MAY WE EMBRACE THE RECONCILING POWER OF ONENESS WITH CHRIST. MAY THIS ONENESS GUIDE OUR CONGREGATION AS WE LIVE INTO THE NEW REALITIES OF THESE TIMES. AS WE MEET NEW PARTNERS IN MINISTRY, MAY WE TAKE TIME TO GET TO KNOW THEM WITH PATIENCE, HUMILITY AND LOVE. HELP US TO SEE HOW SHARING OUR GIFTS WILL MAKE YOUR WORK EASIER AND MORE FULFILLING WHILE BRINGING ALL OF US CLOSER TO CHRIST. MAY THE BLESSINGS YOU GIVE EACH DAY STRENGTHEN US TO A LIVING, DARING CONFIDENCE IN YOUR GRACE. AMEN.

Reports to the Congregation

Pastor's Report

When our church council began studying a book called *Canoeing the Mountains* back in January 2020, little did we know how prescient it would prove to be.

The book follows the famous expedition of Lewis and Clark who set out to explore the western part of the country after the new acquisition of the Louisiana Purchase. They had set out with the assumption that they would find a river to canoe floating easily down as the mapped out the new frontier. Instead, they found the Rocky Mountains. They were trained to canoe rivers not mountains.

For many of us, that is how this past year felt. All the ways we knew how to do church were somehow challenged when COVID-19 struck. There were growing edges as our world changed.

The Wilderness Road

In the Bible, the Hebrews are called and liberated out of Egyptian bondage. God delivers them and begins to take them to the Promised Land. However, before they ever get there, they spend forty long years in the desert wandering in the wilderness.

This is a time of testing as this newfound community must define itself more than just freed slaves. This leads to a reorientation of their identity shaped in this critical time. This wilderness time is an in-between, transitionary time of growth which challenges this community to pull together or perish. Will they trust God is truly their leader taking them to a new place, or will they go back to the familiar place of Egypt. Some want to.

It is in this wilderness time in which the community learns to trust God; they become a stronger community with shared experiences; and they clarify their purpose. For as difficult a season it was for God's people, they emerged ready to enter the promised land.

I believe the pandemic is our wilderness time to redefine that which is sacred to us and home in on what matters most. To be sure there were great challenges and adversity, but there were also great opportunities to grow and witness God's kingdom in new ways.

The Shifting Landscape

At the end of March, we suspended all in-person gatherings. However, new means of ministry developed. Our worship life continued with livestreaming, online access. Over time, we created drive-through communion opportunities. And eventually, we began a regular parking lot worship with a radio transmitter.

Our partnership with St. Andrew Lutheran allowed us to worship together for a season and support one another in a transitional time.

While we were used to seeing one another and checking in on Sunday mornings are various times throughout the week, Zoom online platforms emerged hosting Bible studies, check-ins, and prayer meetings.

Communications began to include biweekly messages to stay in touch with the ministry of the church. A new website was developed to better meet the needs of the changing landscape. Congregational care shifted dramatically to callers reaching out to clusters of folks staying engaged in smaller yet more intimate ways.

Our staffing needs shifted in music ministry as we evaluated our music needs and abilities downsizing the Choir and Bell Director positions.

Service shifted to online sign-ups and utilized the church as a drop-off point. These changes were not easy. If you had had told me I would be preaching from the back of a pickup truck, speaking primarily into cameras, and telling people not to come to the church sanctuary on Sunday morning, I would have thought you were crazy. But God works in surprising ways. I imagine there were plenty of skeptics when the early disciples shared the message that their leader had been raised from the dead and now life was suddenly transformed. But that's the Lord's work - death and resurrection.

This year we mourned the loss of the physical gathered community. However, resurrection is the surprising hope that God's kingdom cannot be stopped as new ways of ministry emerged. Our homes became sacred spaces and mission field became a world in need.

What lies ahead

The road into the new year will be a long one. Vaccines are being distributed and there is a light at the end of the tunnel.

The questions we explore together as God's church as we regather and return to a sense of normalcy, what new things will emerge and how will God shape us in this unprecedented time. My hope is that having gone through this challenging period, this shared experience will bond us together on the things that matter most: loving God, loving people, and serving the world.

A Special Thank You

Words cannot adequately describe my gratitude for this church and all the people who arose to the challenge of ministry. It is one thing to be in a crisis mode and operate at an intense level for a season, but it is another thing to do it for an entire year.

From our leadership to our staff and ministry teams to each of you, it takes a village to carry out the mission. Thank you for your spirit of compassion and generous love.

Continue to pray for our congregation and its leaders as we share the good news of Jesus bringing new life to the world.

Deacon of Faith Formation Report

When I moved to Texas in late September 2019, I knew that there would be a lot of adjustments – moving to a new part of the country, getting settled, learning my way around the area, beginning a new call with two congregations, getting to know the history and culture of each church, balancing my time, and building new relationships. With 20 years of ministry experience and having moved across the country several times, I was prepared for many of these adjustments, or at least I had a pretty good idea of what to expect and how to proceed. Little did I know back then how many new and unpredicted adjustments lay ahead!

As I first began my call here at Peace and St. Andrew, I discovered a welcoming community of faithful and warm-hearted people, committed to worshipping God, serving the community, and caring for one another. Serving as your Minister for Faith Formation this year has reinforced my initial experience, and you have continually shown me great kindness and encouragement. I am deeply grateful for your welcome and ongoing support. It is a joy to be a part of the body of Christ with you!

My focus over the past year has been to get to know you, to spend time with you, to listen to you, to learn your strengths and gifts for ministry, and to explore places where I might contribute to the discipleship of this congregation and each one of you. I brought many ideas with me, knowing that each congregation is unique in some ways, while sharing a common commitment to a life of faith in God as followers of Jesus. For the first several months, sharing ministry was fairly straight forward, a gradual building upon our new relationship as rostered leader and congregation. I like to think of this time of a new ministry like two partners learning to dance together. We were getting into a good rhythm....then 2020 happened.

With the arrival of the Coronavirus pandemic, life changed suddenly for all of us as individuals, for our families, and as a faith community. Familiar routines and patterns of life were disrupted, often quite drastically and in ways none of us could have imagined. It seemed like someone abruptly knocked over the record player that was providing the music for our ministry together. Everything fell silent. We were all caught off balance, unsure of how to proceed, trying to figure out what all of this meant and how we were going to live as a Christian community in a world suddenly turned upside down.

Since that time, we have had to discern the heart of discipleship while seeking for new and creative ways to be disciples. Our worship and community life has been transformed and continues to evolve as we settled into the "new normal". Many of the plans for ministry that I came here with were put on an immediate hold, but many new approaches to ministry have likewise emerged out of this time of disruption and change. Ministry highlights for me during this year include:

- Preaching and assisting in worship
- Conducting workshops and providing resources for the FAITH5 and Taking Faith Home
- Sharing worship with St. Andrew for the first several months of the pandemic
- Beginning our parking lot worship service
- Setting up a studio at Peace for both live and recorded events
- Creating and leading our "Grace Place" virtual weekly children's worship time

- Beginning our "Exploring the Bible Together" video study series with me, Pastor Paul, and Pastor Jake Fain commenting on the excellent videos from our friends at the Bible project
- Delivering faith care packages to our families for Easter, VBS, and Back-To-School
- Creating and sharing a virtual VBS week, complete with Bible stories, puppets, music, and special guests
- Starting our "Bible Book of the Month" newsletter series
- Starting a new confirmation program utilizing technology to keep our youth engaged
- Working with our newly formed Faith Formation Team to actively explore ways to encourage, equip, and support discipleship practices in our congregation
- Serving on our Peace Dialogues leadership team and being a part of our monthly Peace Dialogues
- Putting together our recorded Christmas program featuring our children and youth using our puppets and lots of creative talent

I have also been able to participate in several community and synod-level ministries, including Parish Ministry Training Program (as an instructor), Synod Faith Formation Team, Family Promise, CrossTrails Camping Ministry, the Texas Border Collaboration Network, Kaleidoscope Network, the Beloved Community dialogues, and a whole host of conversations and webinars about learning to be the church in these challenging times.

Amidst all the changes of 2020, two things have not changed: our partnership in the gospel, and the unfailing, abundant, overflowing, amazing-grace-filled love of God. It is God's faithfulness calls us together into community and that allows us to continue to be God's people, regardless of the circumstances surrounding us. We chose our VBS theme verse this summer with this message of hope in mind:

"Be strong and courageous; do not be frightened or dismayed. For the Lord, your God is with you wherever you go." (Joshua 1:9)

Through all the adjustments, changes, challenges, and new opportunities, I am grateful for our partnership in the gospel. It is hard to imagine a year more eventful than 2020, but who knows what God has in store for us as the people of Peace Lutheran Church in 2021. To God be the glory!

Outreach Annual Report

When 2020 arrive, we had great expectations—the arrival of the Co-vid changed all that. In person worship ceased, meetings were held via Zoom and life as we knew it, changed. All of us in Leadership positions were challenged, how would we care for our people? Pastor Jake challenged us all to "think outside the box". Stephen Ministry Report

With the precautions brought about by the pandemic, we have had to modify the way we provide support. In some cases, our Stephen Ministers have maintained contact with their care receivers by phone or video. In a few cases some would meet on occasion in a park or other outdoor setting. Please know that we are still here for you. We look forward to a better year ahead when we hopefully will be able to meet once again face-to-face with care receivers, and to meet again as a ministry team on a regular basis.

Care Team Report

If any of you are gardeners, you might be like me and sprout those seedlings indoors to give them a head start before planting them in your garden. I read that, especially tomato plants, once the green stems surface from the dirt, if you touch and stroke them once a day the plant becomes stronger. It is called the brushing method. Today as I thought about this brushing method, I could not help but reflect on the care team and each of you that have been caring for one another this past year. The brushing is about caring and taking a moment to reach out and be a part of one another's growth. Afterwards, the smell of spring or the fragrance of the plant is left on our fingertips reminding us of the beautiful exchange that happens when we care for one another. The benefit of our effort changes us as well.

Thank you to everyone at Peace that has been part of calling, caring, and reaching out to our members this past year. I feel assured that those of you that have called and those of you that have been called by one of our members have grown and felt the touch (if not physically) of someone in our church. One of our callers wrote: When I was serving communion to my care person, her granddaughter joined us. When we said the "Lord's Prayer" she said, "Oh, that's what my grandmother said to me each night". Brought joy to my heart to see caring for one can also bring awareness of Jesus to another.

Property Report

2020 brought its share of challenges to every committee as we dealt with a partial closure of the facilities making it hard to accomplish all the items that were on our wish list.

We completed our annual fire inspection early in the year. Everything passed and it was noted that several fire extinguishers should be replaced as part of our 2021 inspection process.

A special thanks to our Property Team members for helping with our normal maintenance activities – replacing all the light bulbs in the sanctuary wall sconces and pendants to dimmable LEDs, installing new LED lighting in the Narthex, adding LED strip lighting behind the cross in the Sanctuary, replacing HVAC filters, installing a new, more powerful power supply for our main computer servers, pressure washing the children's playground equipment, and setting and resetting thermostat controls based on the changes to our occupancy due to COVID-19. A special thank you to David Martin (a.k.a. Santa) for his help in repairing the attic stairway which twice jumped the track and failed to operate.

Some minor repairs were made to keep our HVAC systems in good working order. As previously noted in the 2019 Property Report, five units were installed back in 2005 and should be replaced soon. Continued maintenance was performed to keep them operational with no guarantee as to their longevity.

Based on approval of our 2020 budget, a new contract for lawn maintenance services was issued to Liberty Lawn and Landscaping of New Braunfels. They have done a very good job maintaining the property, including eliminating the weeds and keeping the shrubs trimmed in our planting beds.

We had some unforeseen expenses occur when the City of New Braunfels installed sidewalks on our property. Irrigation lines were initially installed within the City's easement and had to be relocated at our expense. That work was performed by Seeger Sprinklers of New Braunfels as well as some minor system repairs resulting from lines and controls being damaged because of concrete shifting near the irrigation control box located in the children's play area. Three irrigation heads were also added to ensure that our lawn was getting properly watered. All this was performed with the savings realized from our new lawn maintenance contract which came in significantly under budget.

A contract was awarded to Freedom Painters of New Braunfels in November to repaint the Sanctuary. The work was completed the last week of November when there were no church activities scheduled. Additional work is being outlined in the Sanctuary to redesign the sound booth. The larger booth will help accommodate the addition of our video systems and new sound board allowing more people in the booth and provide better separation. These activities were initially scheduled to be completed the week of December 28th but have been temporarily put-on hold.

I usually prefer to begin annual reports with a scripture verse. But when reflecting on this past year the only "word" that comes to mind to describe the work and plans of the Worship Team is the one above. Oh... the Liturgical Year of Advent, Christmas, Epiphany, Lent and so on, flowed as smoothly as ever... but almost every plan we made for worship to celebrate it had to be made twice depending on whether we would be worshiping in-person or online, online only, inside the sanctuary, outside on the lawn in chairs, or outside on the parking lot in cars. In short, we learned to pivot – and pivot quickly. But there was worship and there was the joy of stretching ourselves to learn new and creative ways to do the same things in new and different ways!

For example, while we consistently attempt to surround our worship space with banners, colors, screen images and lighting to emphasize the season or festival, we quickly discovered that with livestream what worshippers were seeing on computer screens and TVs was only the very front of the sanctuary. Visuals – the processional cross, the font, the banners, the pulpit, the flags, the Easter Cross, the Christmas tree, even the chairs! – had to be constantly evaluated for placement in the view of the camera. Some of our exciting ideas had to be discarded... but we learned what really mattered, what needed to be seen and how it needed to be shown. We are grateful for those who installed, maintain, and know the video system and internet links that made this transition possible and allowed us to partner in worship with St. Andrew for many weeks during the spring. But in addition to the "mechanics" of worship – the sights, the sound, the movement, the timing - for virtual worship we also had to consider how we could extend worship from the sanctuary to the screen to the home theologically.

One of my favorite memes this year has been one in which the "devil" snickers and says to God, "Look what I've done. I've closed down every one of your churches!" And God smiles back and says simply, "And I've opened one... in every home!" Working together with Faith Formation we have striven to encourage ways for families to make sacred spaces in their homes and to have materials that allow them to "enact" and "experience" alongside what is taking place in the sanctuary: distributing ashes for Ash Wednesday; encouraging families to cut branches or leaves to wave on Palm Sunday, to light and extinguish candles for Good Friday Tenebrae, to bring in flowers for Easter; videoing families to share their wreaths for Advent. We recognized how much our senses play a major part in our worship experience. The major sensual experience we have each time we worship is the sharing of the body and blood of Christ in the sacrament of Holy Communion.

At first the recommendation was to fast from the sacrament until we could be together and share safely in distribution again. But after so many weeks there was so much longing. The initial response to "drive through and pick-up communion" was greater than expected but we soon discovered that it was not feasible as often as most would like. We thought, studied, and prayed over "virtual communion." While it is definitely not the same as being together in the body... and while not everyone feels as comfortable and confident about it... what we believe is that

God is present and has worked in many ways in the past... how could we now say Christ cannot still come to us as we gather to hear his word and bless the bread and wine over "the net."

While we were not in the building, while singing and group music had to be suspended, we believed that it would be a good opportunity - as well as a major step forward for the congregation - to evaluate the entirety of the music program. A task force has been in place for several weeks and we look forward to their recommendations based on the observation, the listening, and the research they have done. We appreciate and give thanks for the many musicians – too numerous to name - who have shared their talents during this time and our Music Director, Marianne, who has coordinated them. The coming year promises to be filled with new opportunities for sharing these gifts of God!

Hopefully, we will soon be safely back together in our newly repainted worship space. We will worship and sing praise to God; we will pass the peace with handshakes and hugs; we will have fifth Sundays and park picnic services. We will continue toward our Worship Team goals: to build community through worship; to increase participation and persons participating in worship; to build discipleship through worship; to offer differing worship experiences/styles of music; to create the feeling of holy space. We will move forward with what we have learned. We will give thanks to God that during this time God has blessed us and increased in us the gift of worshipping and the joy of sharing our worship with the world in even greater ways than we could ever have imagined.

Thanks to our music staff of Jeannie Kawazoe and Marianne Gould and the other members of the Worship Team who work together marvelously: Lupe Travis (Altar Guild), Becca Clark (council), Kathi Anderson (flowers), and especially to Pastor Jake who has worked overtime through this year, tirelessly, with grace and good humor. Thanks be to God!

Finance Team Report

First, thanks to all of you who have given so faithfully and generously through this year. There are those of us who could not give as much as we pledged when the year started and there were those who found they could give more. We were fortunate to apply and receive a forgivable loan through the Payroll Protection Plan in the Federal CARES act to assist organizations through the pandemic. Through the year we were blessed with special monetary gifts and we found new ways to Love God, Love People and Serve the World. The administrative and spiritual leaders, staff and council had daily practice in walking by faith and learned that God's grace is sufficient for the day. It is not easy, but it is fulfilling, and the walk continues into 2021.

Have you ever noticed that our budget begins with Benevolence? When Peace Lutheran Church formed, the original members made a pledge of 10% to support the ELCA SWT Synod and through them worldwide ministries. We have learned this year that we are a global connected

community and if we work together, we all benefit. As Jesus taught "Whatever you do for the least of these brothers and sisters of mine, you did for me." Matt 25:40

We also support local organizations in which we are an active partner such as the Food Bank, Family Promise as well joining our community of churches in New Braunfels area to support rent and utility assistance through the Family Life Center. We support the future leaders in the church through the Seminary Tuition Assistance and the Lutheran Advantage Scholarship at Texas Lutheran University. During the year we have monthly special "Noisy" offerings to support more non-profits.

When the virus changed the way, we do church and ministry, no one knew how long it would last. We have learned many new ways of living our faith serving and connecting with community this past year.
