#### **Exploring Nehemiah's Tears**

Nehemiah's name means "comforted by the Lord". How does Nehemiah's story embody this name?

Jerusalem and the Temple were symbols of God's might and protection to the people. Now the walls of the city literally and metaphorically were in disarray. What symbols do we cling onto?

Nehemiah cries for days and prays before the Lord when he hears the news of the plight of his people. In what ways does this exhibit his faithfulness?

# Saying No and Saying Yes

Nehemiah needed to say no to the comfort of his own life far away from the suffering of his people in Jerusalem.

What do you need to say no to in order that you might say yes to God's call?

What does our church need to say no to so that it might say yes to God's call?

#### **Confession as Preparation for Renovation**

Nehemiah does not begin the renovation project by assigning blame on anyone else. He begins with himself and his own people, and he asks for God's forgiveness.

How might confession prepare us for spiritual renovation?

Do you find yourself wanting to start by blaming someone else? Is that how leaders act today?

- Who puts the tears in your eyes?
- What do you need to say no to in order that you might say yes?
- What do you need to be honest about?
- What promises do you need to remind God so that you can be reminded of God's promises?
