Connecting Our Stories

In this chapter, we learn about the Jewish observance of the Festival of Booths, also know as "Sukkot" in Hebrew. It is a remembrance of God's faithfulness, bringing the Hebrew people out of their centuries of slavery in Egypt, and how the people lived in tents during their time of wandering in the wilderness for 40 years. The people remember that through it all, God provided for them. In Leviticus 23:39-43 we read about God's command that the people remember this time in their history each year by observing this festival and living in tents for one week.

- What are some of your family traditions that help you remember your past?
- What are some church traditions that help us remember our past as God's people?
- Why is it important to set aside time for these opportunities to remember?

The Big Reveal

The wall around Jerusalem had finally been built. With the leadership and guidance of Nehemiah, a wall that had been destroyed and left in ruins for 150 years had been built back new, stronger and better than before. It was a tremendous accomplishment. The rebuilding of the wall symbolized an important stage of the Jewish people's return to their homeland, and gave them a sense of security and reassurance for their present and future lives. They were home!

And yet, the first thing that they do when they finish their huge renovation project is to go live in tents. Why do you think they would do such a strange thing? Why not just enjoy their new wall and move into their homes?



They found written in the Law, which the Lord had commanded to Moses, that the Israelites were to live in temporary shelters during the festival of the seventh month.

Nehemiah 8:14
