

A Message from the Pastor

The Building Is Done, Now What?

This Fall we embarked upon a journey with the Old Testament book of Nehemiah. We learned about his call to return and rebuild the ancient city of Jerusalem that lied in ruins.

He faced all kinds of obstacles from his own people and from outsiders trying to prevent him from that mission. And even when the building was completed and there was much celebration, the Old Testament story continues. The people had their city back; the Temple was restored. Now what?

We as Peace Lutheran find ourselves asking that same question. Between the pandemic and safety lockdowns to the flood of the



church building, we've been putting a lot of focus into restoring the building. Praise God, it has been restored and looks better than ever! A special thanks to John Kassel who spearheaded the effort to get this 8-month project moving.

But again, now what?

We work in rhythms and routines in our lives, and when they are disrupted, it takes a new mobilization effort to get back on track. My hope is that the building was always a metaphor for our community. Although it had been hit hard by the flooding, it was really about us building something together once again. Weathering the storm of pandemic and flood and then moving beyond that.

When Noah and his family built the arc, they did it to survive the flood. Often, we forget his story doesn't end with the end of the flood. The arc was just a temporary measure. They got off the boat and Genesis 9 tells us the first thing Noah does is plant a vineyard.

I think that's a good lesson for us. When you're in a catastrophe, the mission shift to weathering the storm. But there comes a time when the rainbow emerges and the celebration commences, to begin to plant new roots of life meant to grow. Where might you plant new roots of faith and continue to grow so that the vineyard will provide not only for the community of Peace, but to the world we are called to serve?



As we begin a new season in the church year – the season on Advent is a new beginning – that we might replant our roots in Christ and grow in faith, hope, and love together.

Pastor Jake, Pastor Paul Miller and I created a weekly series of recorded Bible studies focused around the excellent Bible Project videos (www.bibleproject.com), beginning with a 19 episode series on *"How To Read The Bible"*. From there we continued to record even



Our hope continues to be that you find these videos interesting, helpful, and educational in understanding the Bible more deeply.

Recently we just completed recording our 65th episode of Exploring the Bible Together! Given the substantial library of videos we have created, we've decided to shift our energy and attention to creating some new faith resources as we enter 2022. Our focus is practical, simple, shareable resources that we hope you will find helpful in your daily faith walk. So, at least for now, we are taking a break from recording new episodes of Exploring The Bible Together. However, all of these videos can always be found both on our YouTube page as well as on our website. We pray these video Bible studies are a blessing to you, and encourage you to share them with friends and family as well.

How many times have you anticipated some good news, and yet it does not arrive, or even more so, a disappointment occurs? You feel like you have been forgotten or slighted. You start thinking that life is not fair, that you have done everything that was asked of you, and yet you did not get the promotion or the new job or maybe the new home.

From Our Daily Bread, June 3 2021 "Its Okay to Lament", the book of Lamentations describes the problems that occurred when Jerusalem was destroyed by Babylon. It describes the afflictions, the oppression and the starvation that occurred. Then in (verse 3:22-23) we are reminded that" Because of the Lords great Love we are not consumed, for His compassions never fail. They are new every morning; great is your faithfulness"

Sometimes it feels impossible to believe that "the Lord is good to those whose hope is in Him, to the one who seeks Him "V 25, especially when we don't see an end to our suffering. But we can cry out to Him, trust that He hears us and that He will be faithful to see us through.

From Our Daily Bread, November 1, 2021 "Ring the Bell": Psalm 47, God doesn't always grant us victory over our struggles in this life, whether health related, financial or relational. He's worthy of our worship and praise in even those circumstances because we can trust that He's still "seated on his holy throne" (v.8). When He does bring us to a place of healing - at least in a way we recognize in this early life - it's cause for great celebration.
