Part of what God does is reveal. Faith is the ability to see with God's eyes by trusting in something more than ourselves. Hope is the vision of that which is not realized yet. And love is the action that drives us forward in action.



Our Vision Team continues to discern and wrestle with this question, “What is God’s dream for the world and how do we as a community of faith live into it?”

Throughout the Lenten Daring to Dream series, we received a lot of feedback from the congregation. Each week, we created a word cloud to share with the combined insights of the church.

The images represent those insights. I hope that we’ll continue to dream throughout this year, and that God’s vision becomes clearer, so that we can live it and share it abundantly.

- 4) Have conversations with one another. Ask those vision questions, “What is God’s dream? What are the deepest needs in the world today? How do we fit in? What are the particular gifts we can share?”
- 5) Continue to stay tuned for more opportunities.

From the Desk of Deacon Andrew

How Lutherans Interpret the Bible Series

The Theology of the Cross



Lutherans believe that the death and resurrection of Jesus Christ is the ultimate focal point of the Bible that reveals something profound about God's love for us, and also about God's expectation for how we are to love and treat others. Martin Luther himself came up with the term, the "**Theology of the Cross**", which became a central defining characteristic of the Reformation movement and remains so to this day. The theology of the cross emphasizes that....

† *God's love is most perfectly revealed through the sacrificial death of Jesus on the cross.*

† *God meets us in the midst of our sorrow, our pain, and our brokenness.*

† *The cross is God's embrace of unconditional acceptance, forgiveness, and love.*

† *Grace and forgiveness can and do cost God everything.*

† *God's power is made perfect in weakness, in sacrifice, in vulnerability, not in exerting strength over others.*

† *We cannot save ourselves by our own efforts, no matter how hard we may try.*

† *We do not find God and secure God's favor by reaching a higher level of personal morality.*

† *Christian discipleship is a call to follow Jesus, not merely admire Jesus.*

† *Following Jesus means obedience to God and demonstrating genuine sacrificial love toward others.*

† *Baptism becomes the central event in our lives, the event which tells us who we are and how we are to live.*

† *Through baptism, we are called to die daily to ourselves, to our selfish thoughts, words, and deeds.*

† *Just as we die with Christ through our baptism, we are also raised by Christ to new life, a life shaped by the cross itself.*

† *We stand in solidarity with those on the margins of our society, and offer to them the hope and promise of the gospel.*



"I have been crucified with Christ, and it is no longer I who live, but it is Christ who lives in me. And the life I now live in the flesh I live by the faith of the Son of God, who loved me and gave himself for me."

(Galatians 2:19b-20)

* We reject the "theology of glory", meaning any attempt to establish the kingdom of God through power, triumphalism, wealth, self-righteous influence, oppression, violence, or rejection of the needs of others.

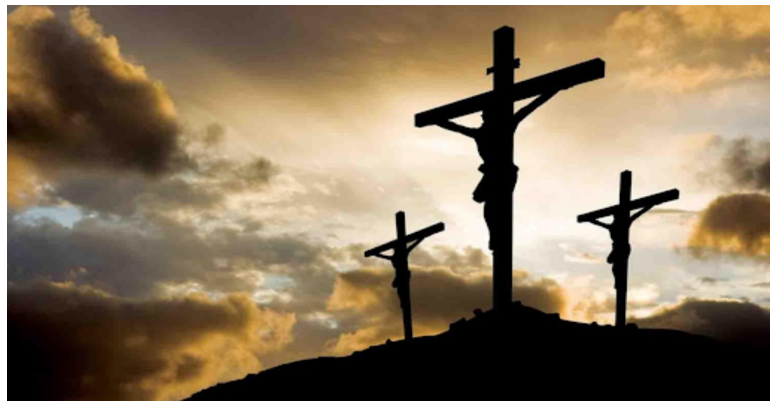
Easter Lilies and Tulips

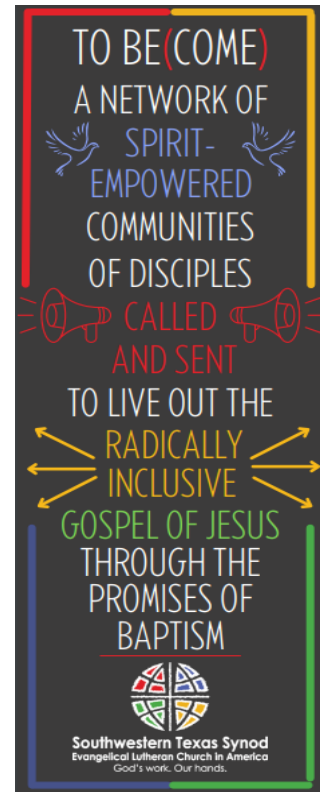
Synod Assembly 2023

Peace Lutheran Church is a part of the Southwestern Texas Synod, one of 65 synods (geographic regions of connected congregations).

The word *synod* comes from a Greek word meaning "to travel a common road—to walk together." The congregations, the people, and the ministries in our expansive geographical region of the Southwestern area of Texas—this is synod. Our local ministry and witness includes 250+ rostered ministers, 120+ congregations, 6 campus ministries, Cross Trails Ministry, numerous ministry partners including Upbring and Lutheran Foundation of the Southwest, the Office of the Bishop, and the Synod Council.

Each year we gather to worship, pray, share good news, and conduct the work of the church together. Much like a congregational annual meeting, the synod assembly shares a similar purpose.

The theme for the 2023 Southwestern Texas Synod Assembly is “Mientras Tanto,” a Spanish phrase meaning “Meanwhile” or “In the Meantime” in English. At the 2022 synod assembly, we dwelt in the story of Philip and the Ethiopian Eunuch (Acts 8:26-40). This year we dwell in the story of the conversion of Saul (Acts 9:1-19). These two stories at first seem in many ways unrelated but are connected in Scripture, being written one after the other and connected by the word “mientras tanto,” “meanwhile.” This year, while dwelling in one story, we also dwell in the reality that many stories are occurring at the same time, that God’s presence is in many places and the Spirit working within many people and communities.

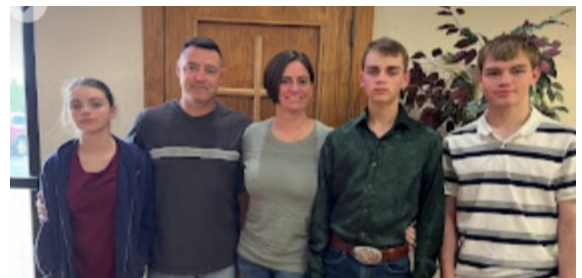
