A Message from the Pastor

Every Day Retreat

As I write in my office I can hear the sound of exuberant children scurrying about the halls of our church facilities during our VBS Day Camp week hosted by the Lutherhill Camp from La Grange.

In addition our young people go off to Camp Chrysalis outside of Kerville each year. My own children have been a part of camp and experience the joy of a retreat uninhibited by the exterior demands of their lives.

Camp is a place where you can be with other kids unabashedly living a life centered on God.



Retreats are so important to us because they allow us to be like a kid again and connect with one another and share in play. Play is one of the most essential elements of retreat, particularly for children because it allows us to enjoy life, socialize with others, and imagine beyond what's right in front of us.

When is the last time you just played? Try it. It is soul-healing.



Time away also allows us to be with other people who are also away from everything else. The amount of things kids have to do this day is astronomical. Friendships are harder and harder to come by because kids are overscheduled. In addition, social media and it's addictive nature draw kids into more isolation than time playing together.

What does your friendship time look like? Time to tend relationships and simply be together is vital for spiritual health.

Finally, kids get to be with the Lord. Whether its singing a silly song, opening a Bible story and re-enacting it with one's peers, walking a trail in God's creation, or sharing a camp meal together these are all holy moments with God.

A Message from the Pastor

One of the most disheartening things is when kids come back from camp dejected because they won't have those same experiences throughout the year. I say, why not? What might that look like for kids and adults to experience Jesus throughout each moment?

How might we be a church that engages one another to interact with God's Spirit moving in our midst right now?

Group that meets every Monday morning at 9:00 a.m. and we have a Prayer loom that is included in our







A Message from the Deacon







During the week of June 26th—30th, eleven of our middle and senior high youth from both Peace and St. Andrew participated in this summer's **GraceWorks Youth Servant Camp**. The purpose behind GraceWorks is simple: to deepen the faith and leadership of our youth by serving, learning, and worshipping together.

<u>W.O.W.</u>

The idea for GraceWorks began when I was serving a congregation in the South Carolina Synod. In 2011, I led our youth group on a mission trip to Knoxville, Tennessee to participate in Win Our World (WOW) Urban Ministry. W.O.W. was created and hosted by St. John's Lutheran Church in the mid 2000's, and is located in downtown Knoxville. W.O.W. evolved from their own youth group's desire to lead their congregation's efforts to serve needs of people in their local community. Over the next few years, St. John's built on this idea and eventually created a destination mission trip program for visiting youth groups that they called W.O.W., inviting middle and senior high youth and adult leaders to come from near and far to spend a week living, learning, worshipping, and serving at St. John's and in the Knoxville area.

Over a six-week span each summer, St. John's would host up to 30 participants per week from multiple congregations. Participants stay in dormitory style housing next to the church. Each day the larger group is divided into smaller teams (6-8 people), and these teams each go into the community to learn through hands-on experience, observing and participating in

A week of serving, worshipping and deepening faith together the work of a wide variety of social service agencies in the Knoxville area and serving the needs of their clients. Many of the agencies with which W.O.W. is engaged serve people experiencing homelessness, but other agencies also include food banks, nursing homes, community gardens, meals on wheels, thrift stores, low income housing, and day care centers. In addition to sending teams to the service sites to grow awareness of the very real needs in the community, the ministry of W.O.W. focuses on building youth leadership skills through a very well developed program of daily worship, learning activities, devotions, and team building.

A New Idea Is Born

After leading youth groups to W.O.W. in 2011 and again in 2013, our youth began to wrestle with the question, "what about the needs of the people back home in our own local communities?" We discovered that there were other youth groups from congregations in our same area of South Carolina who also participated in W.O.W. and were asking that exact same thing. The leaders of these congregations got together to consider that question, and from those discussions the idea of GraceWorks was born and grew to encompass over twenty congregations across several geographic areas of the state.

From South Carolina To Texas

When I came to Texas to serve Peace and St. Andrew, I brought the model of GraceWorks with me. Now in its second year here, GraceWorks Youth Servant Camp is already growing in its impact in our communities, in our congregations, and in the lives of our youth.
