## A Message from the Pastor

#### **Journey Through Holy Week: A Sacred Narrative**

As we approach the solemn and sacred time of Holy Week, we embark on a journey that encapsulates the essence of our faith, marking pivotal moments in the life of Jesus Christ. This week commemorates the final days of Jesus' earthly ministry, his crucifixion, and ultimately, his resurrection. Holy Week is a chance for us to walk in the footsteps of Jesus and behold the fullness of his mission of love.

#### **Palm Sunday: Triumphal Entry**

The week begins with Palm Sunday, a day of celebration and reflection. We remember Jesus' triumphant entry into Jerusalem, where crowds welcomed him with shouts of "Hosanna!" and laid palm branches before him. This event symbolizes the fulfillment of ancient prophecies and highlights Jesus' role as the long-awaited Messiah. Yet, intertwined with this jubilation we find mounting conflict with the Jesus' opposition coming to a head. The declaration of Jesus as the Messiah, the anointed king of God, creates a collision course for the would-be kings and powers of this world.

## **Holy Monday and Holy Tuesday: Teaching and Preparation**

#### Holy Monday and Holy Tuesday: Teaching and Preparation

#### **Holy Wednesday: Reflection and Contemplation**

Holy Wednesday, also known as Spy Wednesday, invites us to pause and reflect on the events leading up to Jesus' betrayal. Judas Iscariot's decision to betray Jesus serves as a dark reminder of the human capacity for weakness and betrayal. It prompts us to examine our own hearts and consider where we might be tempted to compromise our values or betray our Lord.

#### **Maundy Thursday: Last Supper and Foot Washing**

Maundy Thursday commemorates the Last Supper, where Jesus shares a final meal with his disciples, instituting the sacrament of the Holy Communion. Maundy comes from the Latin word, mandatum, which means commandment. It is on this night Jesus gives his disciples a new commandment: to love one another as he has loved them. He also humbly washes his disciples' feet, demonstrating the essence of servant leadership. This profound act of love challenges us to emulate Jesus' humility and to serve others with selflessness and compassion.

#### **Good Friday: Crucifixion and Sacrifice**

Good Friday marks the culmination of Jesus' earthly ministry, as he willingly offers himself as a sacrifice for the redemption of humanity. The crucifixion is facing the reality of the mortal human condition, revealing the depth of Jesus' sacrificial love. As we contemplate the agony of the cross, we are invited to confront our own mortality and sin, and to embrace the transformative power of Jesus' life poured out for us.

#### **Holy Saturday: Vigil and Anticipation**

On Holy Saturday, we enter into a period of vigil and anticipation, awaiting the dawn of Easter morning. This day is a time of quiet reflection, as we contemplate the mystery of Christ's descent into the realm of the dead and anticipate his victorious resurrection. In the midst of darkness, we hold fast to the hope of redemption and renewal that Easter brings.

#### **Easter Sunday: Resurrection and Rejoicing**

Finally, Easter Sunday dawns with the glorious news of Christ's resurrection. Death is conquered, and the promise of new life is fulfilled. 

## New! Sunday Morning Worship with Our Children

God's Story is off to a great start! We have about 20 minutes with the Pre-K through elementary kids in the fellowship hall.



We've had a big group of kids each week who are enjoying this chance to dive into God's Word and have real conversations about our God, Jesus, our faith and our everyday lives. The general pattern we use each week is:

- Read: One of the kids reads the story out of the Spark Story Bible for the group.
- Wonder: We ask the kids about the story they saw and heard ("What do you notice?", "What do you wonder?")
- *Watch & Discuss:* We watch a video presentation by our friends at Illustrated Ministry. These videos contain built in pauses with questions as well as a prayer at the end of the video. The video matches our coloring pages.
- Tell It Back: We ask one or more of the kids to re-tell the story using a variety of teaching props
- Sing: We include some singing (when time permits) to help the kids learn God's story
- Pray: We pray for one another and the upcoming week
- Give: We collect an offering to present to God in worship




## Faith Practices for Everyday Christians






## March 31. 7:00 - 9:30 a.m.
