A Message from the Pastor

Beauty from Ashes

⁴ And looking up, they saw that the stone had been rolled back—it was very large. ⁵ And entering the tomb, they saw a young man sitting on the right side, dressed in a white robe, and they were alarmed. ⁶ And he said to them, "Do not be alarmed. You seek Jesus of Nazareth, who was crucified. He has risen; he is not here. Mark 16:4-6

Two years ago a fire broke out at the Crisis Center of Comal County. It burned their building to the ground. This is the place women would flee to in order to find sanctuary from violence in their own times of crisis. But what happens when the place charged with crisis management is now undergoing a crisis of its own?

The week this happened, I received a call from the Crisis Center. They asked if there was anything the church could—that they had heard Peace Lutheran Church was a community that helped people experiencing crises.



Wow! What an honor to be on that short list. If you think about it, that's how the church should be. We are called to be the beloved community who walks with one another particularly in the struggles of life.

So what did we do? We said yes come and stay with us in this time of crisis as you find your way again. And for the next 2 months the Crisis Center operated out of Peace and found other partners to help navigate the challenges.



This was one of my proudest moments at the church. We had just gone through our own struggle the past couple years. In 2020 we had the pandemic and for a year, we felt the estrangement of a global separation and sickness. Then in 2021, when we were just getting back on our feet, the Texas Winter freeze came and flooded our building. Once again, we experienced a crisis of isolation and rebuilding.

But what happened through all of that? We rebuilt the facilities with more intentionality of serving our community. We added showers and better space for groups to utilize the gifts of our home as a haven of peace. And so when the call came to serve our neighbor in crisis, the answer was easy.

I think about the resurrection promise we find in Jesus. The Christian story is one of death and resurrection over and over again. Out of the crises and brokenness in our lives, God finds a way to rebuild with more compassion and love overflowing to the world.

Let's continue to be the church who responds to the crises our community faces, so that each person may know they'll never face them alone. The Lord is with them rebuilding beauty from the ashes.

Peace Lutheran Church is a part of the Southwestern Texas Synod, 1 of 65 synods in the ELCA.




We are Church. Better Together.

VBS Day Camp



2024 ELCA Youth Gathering Updates

Created To Be: Disruptive

Each month we'll look at one of the five primary themes for the upcoming 2024 ELCA Youth Gathering. In April we will learn about what it means to be disruptive as a disciple of Jesus. Our focus scripture is Matthew 21:12, Jesus overturning the tables in the Temple in Jerusalem. Here are some of our discussion questions:



- · Jesus responded with holy disruption to the injustice he witnessed in the temple.
- · How do you define injustice?
- · What injustices you have experienced, witnessed or become aware of?
- · The religious leaders were angry with Jesus over his actions. Whom do we risk upsetting when we disrupt injustice?
- · Some people are naturally drawn to confrontation, whereas others avoid it at all costs. Where do you find yourself on this spectrum?
- · With your gifts, what role could be a good fit for you in disrupting injustice?

Prayer:

Let us pray. O Lord, you call us to follow you wherever you lead. We know we do not always follow without question if we follow at all. Help us to listen for your call and to prepare for action. Stir your Spirit inside us that we might long to follow you and that people will recognize us as your disciples by the love we share. We pray this in the name of the One who was love, Jesus Christ, our Lord. Amen

Youth Retreat at Slumber Falls

The weekend of April 17-18, ten middle and senior high youth participated in a one day/one night retreat at Slumber Falls Camp here in New Braunfels led by Deacon Andrew and Pastor Jake. This retreat was part of our ongoing confirmation program, which we call "Affirm", emphasizing that affirming our baptism is something we continue to do our entire lives. Our theme for this retreat was "Where Is God In My Life?" Here's the opening statement of our workbook we used as our discussion guide for the retreat:

"It's not always easy to see all the ways that God is present and active in our daily lives. Our time is filled with all sorts of activities, responsibilities and people pulling us this way and that. From the moment we wake up until we finally fall asleep, our daily lives can sometimes feel like a big blur. We all have ups and downs, twists and turns in our lives. There are many things we cannot control. Everything can feel like its swirling and changing, and that nothing is stable.

The good news is that God does not change. God's love for you, God's presence in your life are constant. Remember that just because you can't or don't sense God's presence every day, that doesn't mean God isn't always right there with you.

God is with you. Right here. Right now.

Each morning each day, each evening, each night—GOD IS WITH YOU.

Every second of every day of every month of every year. 24/7/365+


God is closer to you than even your own breath.



Being Neighborly



It was 5:00 am on Saturday Morning and a small group of members gathered in the kitchen at Peace to prepare a breakfast. The breakfast would look familiar to many that have been prepared for special events and holidays at our church. They made scrambled eggs, bacon, hash browns, biscuits and sausage gravy. They also had cinnamon rolls, blueberry muffins, fruit and orange juice. When they were done preparing this breakfast, they packed it all up, put it in hot boxes, loaded up their trucks and took it to First Footing Homeless Shelter. They set it up outside under their canopy and around picnic tables in chafing dishes and platters so it would be as hot as possible. At 7:00am they began serving 40 of the most grateful, friendly, and interesting people in New Braunfels. After all were fed about 8am, they packed up, returned to Peace and were cleaned up by 9am. Just a few hours of work and they made some people very happy and satisfied. One gentleman said that this was his first hot breakfast for months. Others commented that it was such a full breakfast. These are the things that many of us take for granted. It's easy to get up and walk in the kitchen and prepare whatever we want, but that is not the case for everyone. We, at Peace, would like to continue this on at least a monthly basis and bring a little sunshine to their lives. In order to do that we are looking for volunteers and donations.
