# Four Key Pivots for a Changing Landscape Pivot #2—From Membership to Discipleship

Who is God calling us to be?

That question implies that we have not yet arrived. Often times, we make Christianity into a one stage process in which we identify with a faith in the triune God. We lean heavily into what is known as "justification" - that is, being made right with God through the life, death, and resurrection of Jesus.



Where Christians (particularly Lutherans) miss out is the what is known as "sanctification" - that is, the transformation into God's holy likeness.

For many of us, church membership is a familiar concept. We join a congregation, commit to its mission, and participate in its worship and ministries. Membership connects us to a faith community, offering a sense of belonging and shared purpose. But Jesus didn't call people to be members—He called them to be disciples.

Discipleship goes beyond membership. It's not just about belonging to a church; it's about following Christ in every aspect of our lives. In the Gospels, Jesus' invitation is simple but profound: "Follow me." His first disciples left their nets, their routines, and their comfort zones to embark on a journey of transformation. Discipleship is an active, daily commitment to growing in faith, loving like Jesus, and serving others with grace and compassion.

This year we are leaning into four key pivots identified by Luther Seminary through their FaithLead organization. This month we explore our second pivot.

#### Pitfall #2 Keep focusing on building membership, not discipleship

Jesus' aim was not to cultivate members for a church institution, but to grow disciples who would follow in his footsteps.

The inherited pattern that many congregations follow is a membership model that assumes that church members are already disciples (that is, followers) of Jesus. But when churches recruit new members to join and start serving on a committee or ministry team or board, they often skip over a key ingredient: teaching

#### Pivot #2 From membership to discipleship

Churches that thrive intentionally cultivate discipleship by:

- 1) orienting around practices and relationships that connect faith and daily life
- 2) answering questions of meaning, belonging, hope, and purpose

This means learning God's story in scripture and embracing and embodying a ho-

listic Gospel. Faith is not something to be performed by the paid staff leaders on behalf of the community, but rather faith is formed in members through their participation in the community.

So what does this shift from membership to discipleship look like? It means: Moving from attendance to engagement – Worship is essential, but discipleship calls us to live out our faith in daily life.

Growing deeper in faith – Through prayer, Scripture, and community, we seek not just to know about Jesus but to be shaped by Him.

Serving with purpose – We don't just belong to a church; we are the church, called to be Christ's hands and feet in the world.

Inviting others into the journey – Discipleship is not just personal; it's communal. As we grow, we also guide and encourage others.

Jesus didn't say, "Go and make members of all nations." He said, "Go and make disciples" (Matthew 28:19). As we move forward as a church, let's embrace this calling—not just to belong, but to follow, grow, and serve.

- Connect faith and daily life
- 2. Learn God's story in Scripture
- 3. Embrace and embody a holistic Gospel



# "Planting Seeds of Peace"

Please join us for our annual Cibolo Creek Conference event for Women of the ELCA on Saturday, April 26<sup>th</sup> at Peace Lutheran Church in New Braunfels. The theme, "Planting Seeds of Peace", is centered around John 14:27, "Peace I leave with you; my peace I give to you. I do not give to you as the world gives. Do not let your hearts be troubled, and do not let them be afraid." In our lives today, we deal with fear, uncertainty, and division every day. God, through Jesus, assures us that we do not need to fear. We come together as Women of the ELCA to "grow in faith, affirm our gifts, and support one another in our callings". Pastor Judi Miller will be our Bible study leader. We are looking forward to a day of nurturing, fellowship, Bible study, and developing new friendships.

Our day will begin with registration at 8:30 am. Breakfast will be provided. In addition to our Bible study, we will worship together, hear from the Synodical Board, and hold our annual conference meeting. Think and pray about becoming a member of the conference board. All three positions are open election. Registration is \$20 (deadline April 18th).

We will collect a monetary offering, which will be divided 50% to Churchwide, 25% to the Southwestern Texas SWO and 25% to First Footing, a part of New Braunfels Housing Partners, which assists those who are homeless with mental and physical health care, employability skills training, budgeting education and housing navigation. The physical offering will be collected for Peace Lutheran's Parking Lot Pantry. Suggested items are Pop Tarts, Tuna Packets, Crackers, Granola Bars, and Juice Boxes.

### Peace Lutheran Prayer Labyrinth

Things are coming along very nicely for our Prayer Labyrinth. We have installed 3 Memorial Benches, A tree has been planted in memory of Peter Lange, a cross has been erected in the center of the Labyrinth, a Kiosk has been placed at the entrance to the Labyrinth and the lines have been drawn for the walking layout. We had our first workday on March 15 to cut the lines and we laid down 1000 bricks. We are getting very close to completion. We were very blessed to have received a donation of about 500 bricks from Karl Stellges. This donation helped keep my purchase of 1000 bricks from Home Depot within my Foundation budget. A huge thank you to our Labyrinth workday crew, it was an amazing morning of great Teamwork.

#### **Council Corner**

As a church, we have made great progress over the last few years with implementing our mission, vision, and values. We also have ambitious goals and great momentum. One of these goals is improving our communications. This new feature will provide monthly updates from the Council about the business of the church. The Council also welcomes your input, ideas, and feedback. We are working on some options to make it easy for you to contact us, but for now, feel free to reach out to any member of the Council if you have a concern. Here are a few of the issues the Council discussed in March.

- Plumbing Leaks Repairs to the foundation were completed in February at a cost of \$18,000. Following the repair, a plumbing leak was found under the building. The leak must be repaired to ensure the warranty on the foundation work and prevent further damage. Fixing the leak will cost approximately \$19,000. The cost of these repairs will deplete our building maintenance funds, which have not fully recovered from the expenses associated with the building flood in 2021. If you would like to help with these expenses, please consider a donation or dedicate an offering to our building maintenance fund.
- Synod Assembly The Synod Assembly will be held on May 3 at Abiding Presence in San Antonio. Kathi Anderson and Michael Simpson will be attending as voting members for Peace this year.
- Communications The Council is exploring ways to improve communications among church leadership and the congregation.
- Sabbatical A pastoral sabbatical is a dedicated period of rest, reflection, and renewal after several years to enhance leadership and energy for both the pastor and congregation. In the coming months, the congregation will learn more about sabbaticals in general and what a sabbatical period might look like at Peace. The Council adopted a Sabbatical Policy in February, and an application for grant funding for a future sabbatical was submitted in March.
