A Message from the Pastor



Walking the Way of Love: What the Ten Commandments Teach Us

This summer, we journeyed together through the Ten Commandments—not as a list of dusty old rules, but as a living guide for how we might faithfully love God and love our neighbor in the here and now.

Week by week, we discovered that these ancient words are less about "you shall not" and more about "this is the kind of life that sets you free."

We learned that honoring God's name is not just about our speech, but about representing God's character in the world. That Sabbath is not only a rest from work, but a bold act of trust in God's care. That prohibitions against stealing, killing, lying, and coveting are also invitations to generosity, compassion, truthfulness, and gratitude. The commandments call us into relationships marked by fidelity, respect, and justice.

When Jesus was asked which commandment was the greatest, He answered simply: "Love the Lord your God with all your heart, soul, and mind... and love your neighbor as yourself" (Matthew 22:37-39). Everything we studied this summer is rooted in those two loves. Every "you shall not" points toward a deeper "you shall": You shall love, protect, cherish, and serve.

As we turn the page from summer into fall, it's a perfect time to begin anew in our spiritual practices—renewing our commitment to live out these commandments in everyday life. Here are some ways to practice them:

- Make space for Sabbath Choose one day or even a few hours each week to unplug from work and technology, rest your mind, and delight in God's presence.
- **Speak with grace** Speak truthfully and with kindness; and when you can't speak love into a conversation, choose silence and prayer.
- Practice generosity Share abundantly with your neighbors and with those in need: your gifts, energy, and time.
- Honor relationships Keep your promises, show up for those you love, and resolve conflict with grace.
- Cultivate gratitude Each day, name three things you're thankful for, focusing on God's gifts rather than what you lack.
- Protect life Look for ways to bring peace, reconcile broken relationships, and care for those who are vulnerable.




The Ten Commandments are not a burden to bear—they are a gift to embrace. They show us what love for God and neighbor looks like when it takes shape in real life. May we walk forward from this summer ready to live that love in every word we speak, every choice we make, and every neighbor we meet. And may this fall be a season where our faith is not only remembered, but actively practiced—so that God's way of love becomes our way of life.



September Mission Spotlight is Peace Little Pantry

In May 2022, Becky Voges introduced our faith community and our church neighborhood to the Little Pantry.

The concept began in Arkansas in 2016 by a woman who wanted to love as Jesus loves and give her neighbors and travelers basic necessities.

Our Little Pantry contains non-perishable foods, juice boxes, bandaids and other personal hygiene items, as well as a cooler stocked with bottled water, absolutely essential for Central Texas.

A small box beneath the pantry offers visitors an opportunity to provide prayer requests as they continue on their journey.

Grocery donations are needed....non-perishable food items in small cans with ring tabs, small juice boxes, bottled water and personal hygiene items such as toothpaste, toothbrushes, bandaids....Please place your donations in the SOS Food grocery cart in the Narthex.
